Drug & Alcohol Information

In compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 (Public Law 100-690, Title V, Subtitle D) and the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendment of 1989 (Public Law 101-226), it shall be the policy of Clackamas Community College to maintain a drug-free campus for all employees and students. It is the responsibility of the College to notify students and staff of College policy. In accordance with this intent, the following policy is in effect:

Drug-Free Campus. *The unlawful possession, use or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol is prohibited on the College campus, in all College facilities, or as part of any College-sponsored activity. Violators of this policy will be prosecuted to the full extent of State and Federal law and, in addition, there are specific consequences for employees and for students which are stated in the College Drug and Alcohol Policy.*

Complete information including federal and state laws, where you can find assistance, health risks associated with the use of illicit drugs and the abuse of alcohol and warning signals is available at the Counseling Department and Student Activities Office.

Campus Safety

Two full-time and six part-time Campus Safety Officers provide safety and security Monday-Sunday 8 a.m. to midnight (local law enforcement provides additional late night coverage) for about 30,000 students and staff at four campus sites including Wilsonville; the Clackamas-area Harmony Center; and the Oregon City campus. Student cadets are on duty in the evenings to provide student and staff escort services and other types of assistance under the supervision of the Campus Safety officer on duty.

Active "campus watch" participation by students and staff has been instrumental in the prevention and reporting of criminal activity. To report a crime or one in progress call 911 then call Campus Safety for further action at 971-563-0101.

As time permits, Campus Safety officers perform courtesy services for students and staff, which include vehicle battery jump starts, and temporary tire inflation (but not changing). These services may be requested by calling either 503-657-6958, ext. 2234 or 971-563-0101 (duty officer cell phone).

Crime Statistics

The Department of Campus Safety responded to 12,806 calls for service during the 2006 school year, including 174 vehicle jump starts, The Department issued 178 parking citations and 114 warnings for on-campus traffic enforcement violations.

The following table reports crime statistics for the past three calendar years as required by law. Numbers without parentheses indicate incidents on the Clackamas Community College campus, including the main campus in Oregon City, Wilsonville/ OATC and the Harmony/OIT Metro Center. Numbers in parentheses refer to incidents on public property, including streets, sidewalks and parking facilities immediately adjacent to the campus.
